"The above picture shows Miss M. Hulford of the A.E.N.E. Car Service wearing the new uniform which will replace the familiar green pattern used here for so long. It was considered that the old design, based on a military style, was unsuited to the needs of A.E.N.E. A further reason was that it is the uniform of the Official Car Service operated for Government Departments by Ministry of Works, with which the Establishment has now no transport connections.

Consequently, a design based on a new conception was sought. British European Airways proved most helpful and the above style is the result. It is almost identical with the B.E.A. air hostess uniform. Gone is the military style jacket with breast pockets, and shirt with collar and tie. The new outfit is feminine in appearance and the collar and tie are replaced by a simple cream-coloured blouse with a round collar. The familiar shade of dark green in barathea material is retained since it is smart in appearance and serviceable in wear.

A dark green belted raincoat with a detachable fleece lining for winter use will be provided instead of the existing heavy pattern great coat.

The uniform is being tried-out by one driver, so as to test whether it is fully suited to driving conditions. When this has been ascertained, all drivers will be equipped with the new outfit."


A. E. R. E. CHALLENGE CUP
