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NIRNS Treatment of Large Spoil Heap to South of
Magnet Building

In October of last year, you put to the General Purposes Committee a paper on the treatment of the large spoil heap south of the Magnet Building. It was agreed that the simplest of the schemes outlined in the paper should be developed, and the market tested in order to get a more accurate assessment of the cost. We have now obtained estimates, and I am minuting you separately informing you of the name of the lowest tenderer, which, of course, at this stage is confidential.

Our estimate based on the lowest tender is as follows:-

Shaping and spreading of material	..	..	£13,750
Seeding	..	..	£ 4,000
Work to other Services	..	..	£ 500
Allowance Factor	..	..	£ 1,500
TOTAL			<u>£19,500</u>

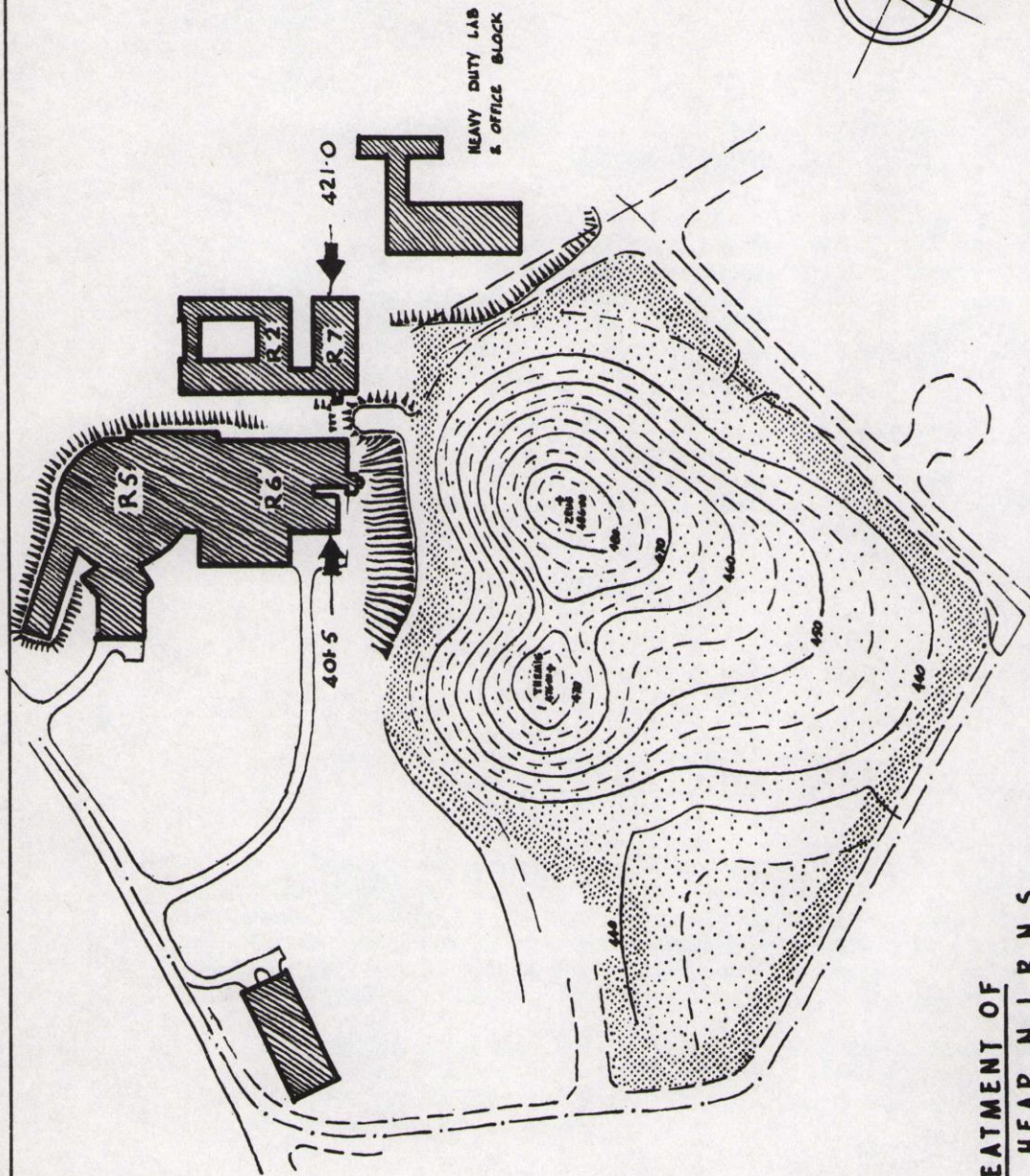
This estimate excludes fees, but in view of the number of schemes that we have prepared, I feel that you would be well advised to allow 15 per cent of the ultimate cost.

I enclose for reference, 2 sketches - Sheet 1 showing the plan of the area after treatment, and Sheet 2 which shows the plan of the material as at present. Briefly, as you are aware, the scheme is to shape the area to the minimum extent consistent with obtaining good aesthetic results and to sacrifice free access to the hill as the northern slope will not be shielded from the Experimental Area. This is in accordance with your final briefing.

It should be noted that this estimate excludes any question of fencing at this stage, as I gather from Mr. Snowden that this is a matter best resolved after the shaping has been completed, when a more accurate assessment of the problem can be made.

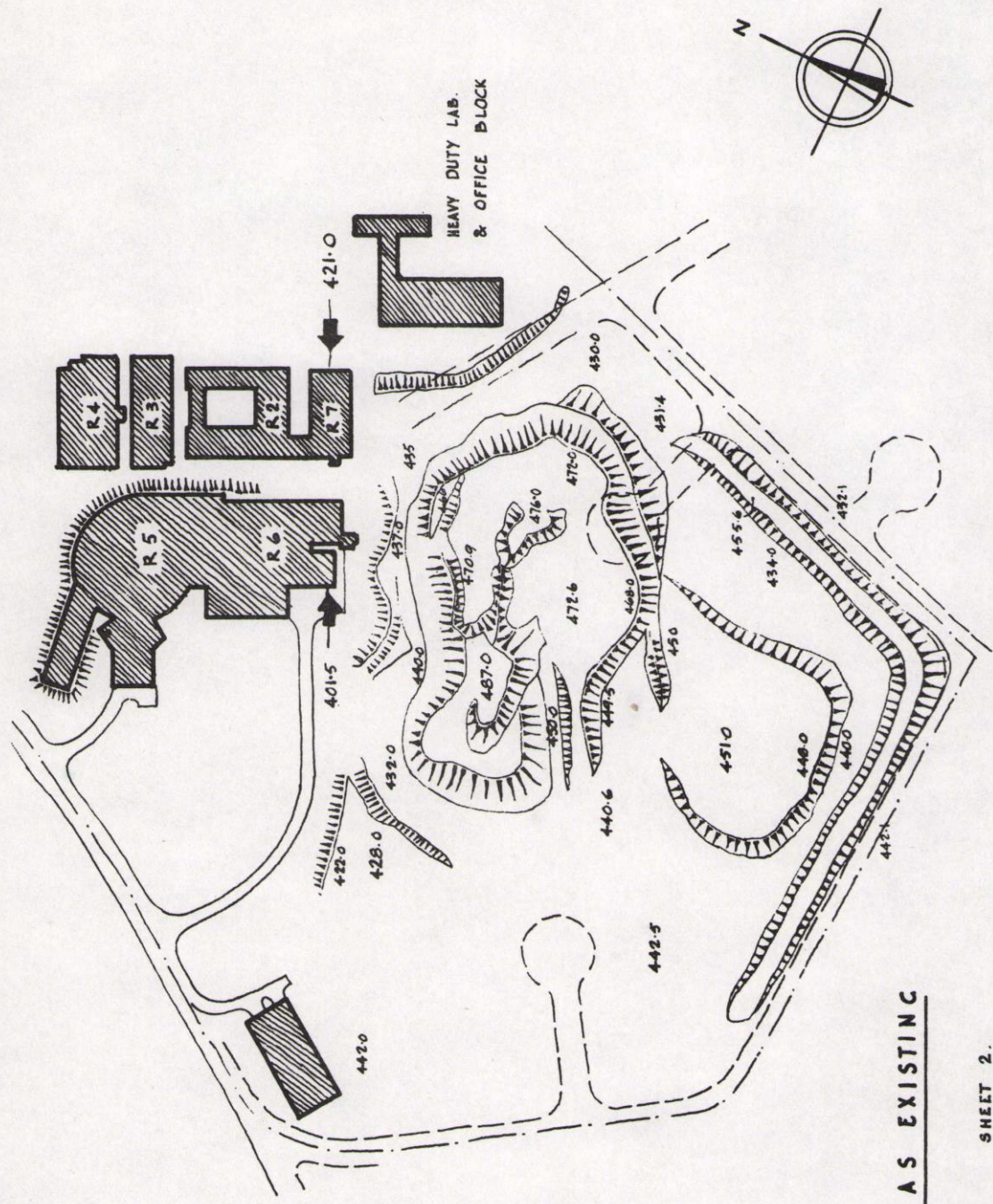


**PROPOSED TREATMENT OF
